Schedule

Working days from Tuesday to Saturday

Access is allowed from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. for individuals and until 5:00 p.m. for groups of more than ten people.

The museum closes its doors at 7:00 p.m., beginning its evacuation at 6:45 p.m.

Sundays and holidays

Access is allowed from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for individuals and until 12:30 p.m. for groups of more than ten people.

The museum closes its doors at 2:00 p.m., and evacuation begins at 1:45 p.m.

Public holidays in València are on January 22, March 18 and 19, August 15, October 9 and 12, November 1 and December 6, 8, 24 and 31.

Private visits

For individuals, families and groups of less than ten people, a prior reservation is not necessary due to, normally, there is no problem accessing the museum upon arrival, beyond the coincidence that there is some group at that moment accessing it, but this usually does not last more than four or five minutes.

This wait can be much longer **between March 8 and 23**, due to the celebration of *Semana Fallera*, which makes the massive influx of visitors foreseeable, **period in which no entry time is reserved to access the museum.**

It is advisable to purchase at least one audio guide for sale at the price of 1 euro. It works on your mobile phone or tablet using a QR code or link to a website, the museum has free WIFI, and allows you to organize the visit at your leisure, resulting in an interesting tool to delve into interesting aspects of this fascinating festival.

It is recommended to schedule your visit in advance to be able to enjoy the museum peacefully, due to people who visit us usually stay in the museum between 80 and 100 minutes, to visit our five permanent collections and our temporary exhibition, with enough time to read everything the posters and understand the particularities of a festival recognized as UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity since 2016.

Group visits (more than 10 people)

A confirmed prior reservation is required to visit the museum in a group. This reservation will only be made by email to visitesmuseufaller@valencia.es **at least two weeks in advance of the planned date of your visit**, although for agencies, schools and falls, please make your reservation more in advance, in order to find suitable dates for your visit to the museum, especially if you plan to visit us between February and June, which are the months when the museum has the greatest number of visitors.

In your email you must clearly state whether it is a group from an agency, educational center or commission with the following information:

- **Name of the group, agency, school or *comisión fallera*.**
- **Number of people or students.**
- **Number of guides or accompanying teachers.**
- **Day of the visit.**
- **Requested time.**

Once your request and availability have been verified, the reservation documentation will be sent to you with its confirmation.

General information

- Photos can be taken without flash.
- The museum is fully accessible for people with reduced mobility.
- All ninots are explained in four languages.
- In addition to the audioguides, some ninots are explained in braille.
- Smoking, eating and drinking is prohibited in the entire museum building.
- We do not have luggage lockers.
- Payment in cash or card is only accepted at the museum reception at the time of your visit.
- Guide dogs are allowed.
- Dogs weight less than 10 kg are allowed and always carried in the carrier or in the arms of the carrier, and they may not walk loose or tied around the museum premises or its interior at any time.
- Dogs over 10 kg are not allowed based on Royal Decree 1021/2022.
- We have explanatory posters to understand the thematic, historical and artistic evolution of the *ninots* pardoned from fire by popular vote.

On the rear façade of the museum you can see a magnificent mural by Antonio Marest, co-financed by the EU. Current urban art links directly to the origin of *les Falles* as precursors of street art.

For the museum staff it is a pleasure to welcome you and put our facility at your disposal so that you have a very pleasant time.
