
## 1. Benimàmet Wayside Cross. Plaza de Camporrobles



The old quarter of Benimàmet, or Poble Baix, was formed from:

El Camí vell de Paterna, and El Camí de Burjassot which were located in the Plaza de la Cruz, marking the municipal boundary, in what is now Plaza de Camporrobles.

Number 6 is the house-studio of the painter Ismael Blat (1901-1976), which has a garden and Moorish arch as seen from the Paterna road.

The Camí Vell de Paterna, continued from Beniferri to Paterna, crossing the Endolza ravine. It passed through the current streets: calle de Bernardo Prieto (calle Valencia), Plaza de la Tienda, Titaguas (calle iglesia), Plaza doctor Ximeno (Plaza de la iglesia) y Párroco Cobos (calle Paterna).

**The Camí de Burjassot**, left Burjassot going towards the Plaza de laCruz, along calles Rafael Tenes Escrich (Calle Burjasot), Plaza de Alborache (Plaza del Calvario) and along Calle Carpinteros.

As the population grew, Poble Baix expanded towards the upper part of the town, heading for where the current Trade Fair is, forming the residential area **Poble Alt**, which was crossed by the tracks of the local Valencia railway network.
